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The PreSchool

The PreSchool is thriving with nearly 200 children enrolled this Autumn. This report (including photographs) was received from Mabinty Sesay, the manager of the project.

Hi all, thanks very much for the good work you have been doing in our community. Update on the ongoing projects: i.e. Pre school and toilets

For the toilets we have completed wall height we are now preparing to do roofing, plastering, tiling and a lot more.

Pre school: we have finished paving the floor, and doing the ceilings of the classrooms. We are now waiting to do the plastering and painting and many more. The preschool is going on well. We have admitted over two hundred pupils which we need to add two more teachers and a caregiver.

As we promised the last time we going to charge the parents this academic year; they have agreed to pay Le 20,000 twenty thousand per term. This money will be spent for the smooth running of the school while awaiting government approval. Meanwhile this money can't be enough to pay teachers. Parents have shown so much interest to send their kids in the Pre school. We hope to enrol more pupils for the second term. Thank you all.

The children currently being enrolled are not 'Ebola orphans' and so charging parents a small sum is a good way of making the preschool viable. 20,000 Leones is about £2. The Olney Newton Link cannot employ people in Sierra Leone so we are unable to help by directly paying salaries. Building the toilet block means that the preschool complies with government regulations and so will be able to be registered and get government funding.

Sierra Leone News: Lack of access to clean water, toilets puts children's education at risk

Millions of children are going to school without basic hygiene facilities, and the goal of universal access to basic water, sanitation and hygiene remains "a huge challenge," the United Nations warned on Monday 27th August 2018.

In Sierra Leone, the report noted, only 19.0% of people wash their hands with soap after contact with faeces; 66.3% wash with water only and 14.7% did not wash their hands at all. Hand washing practices are poorer before contact with food with 10.2% washing their hands with water and soap, 48.3% with water only and 41.5% do not wash their hands at all.

In addition to the lack of wash facilities, inconsistent access to soap is another of the big barriers. The compliance to the national standards in schools is a big challenge, the report said. " Only 9.5% of schools have water supply facilities up to the standards in their school compound. And half of them are not functional." The report concludes that 4.6% of primary schools meet the national standards in sanitation facilities adding that schoolchildren in 40.4% of surveyed schools practice open defecation in school and non-existence of latrines and lack of privacy such as no doors are three leading causes of open defecation.

The annual report is produced by the World Health Organization/'UN Childrens Fund Joint Monitoring Programme. Kelly Ann Naylor, Global Chief of Water, Sanitation and Hygiene at UNICEF, said, "If education is the key to helping children escape poverty, access to water and sanitation is key to the well being and health of children to safely maximise their education." by Sylvia Villa
