Mahmoud answers Claire Tarawally's questions in August 2016

Mahmoud and I have been visiting Olney since the end of July. For me it was a delight to return to my home again and see friends and family, for Mahmoud it was the first chance to see where I was brought up. He has spent the last 3 years showing me his culture, now it was my turn!

Towards the end of our stay we asked him some questions....

What have you found most enjoyable?

The sightseeing as history, the different vegetation and time to walk around as we don't get that in Sierra Leone. The even distribution of shops and markets has really impressed me. The fact you can sit in your own home and purchase things to be delivered. Having 24 hour power and water supply and that is also evenly distributed. Flowers are all over which is never done at home, and I wish our people would think about it more. The transport system in London especially the underground and how fast you can get from one place to another. Variety and abundance of food—pizza is one of my favourites.





What have you found most confusing?

The road network and driving on the right. The shopping system - not using cash you hardly see money passing from one person to another so it is difficult to keep track of the cost of things

First impressions?- The setup of the airport, the immigration system being well organised. The cleanliness and upkeep of the country.





What has left a lasting impression?

The constantly changing weather, and the length of the day as at home night begins soon after 7pm and day begins 7am throughout the year.





What do you think is done better in Sierra Leone?

Social interaction. There we greet everyone which is not done here. Friends have made me feel very welcome but.........

When we went to a social event here I was really surprised at how friendly everybody was, it was fantastic! That changed my perspective on the interaction as I now appreciate how it happens with the way you live your lives.





What will you miss?

Food, power, water and the fact we don't have to carry water from the well to the house is what will be missed!! I will certainly miss cake! Oh, and the ease of transport and how quickly you can move from place to place.





Mahmoud and I would not have had the fantastic time we did without the generosity and love of my parents Rachel and Brian. And to see so many friends old and new will stay with us forever. All both of us can say is THANK YOU and how much we will miss you.


