

News from Newton

A Terrible Accident

We are just getting reports of an accident in Wellington, on the main road from Freetown to Newton... a petrol tanker was involved in a collision and subsequently exploded. First reports state that nearly 138 were killed and more than 100 injured. The victims reportedly included people who had gone to the scene to collect fuel from the leaking vehicle. The WHO said they would send medical supplies and specialists to assist the Freetown hospitals.

Honestly Anne is really terrible and thanks to u all people of Olney U/K for sympathizing with us at this difficult time.

Those of us who have been to Newton have travelled along this road and know how busy and chaotic it is. Our thoughts are with our friends in Sierra Leone.

The Newton Preschool

Mabinty Sesay, preschool manager, sent an urgent request for money to replace the broken plastic chairs in the preschool. These chairs become brittle with time due to the high temperatures and exposure to UV light.

Mabinty messaged...

I have talked with the carpenters. We need 50 sets of desk and chairs. Because we have to space the children to observe the rules of NACOVAC. The cost of one set is 280,00 Le.

We have tried plastic chairs many times but when they get spoiled we can't repair them that's why we are trying board this time.

Trustees decided to send the requested £1000 needed to provide the materials and labour.

(NACOVAC is the Covid Emergency Operation Centre which has issued guidelines for preventing the spread of the virus. To date there have been nearly 7000 cases and 121 deaths... but reporting may not be totally reliable.)

Message received on Thursday 4th November

Good morning to all members of Olney .

Meeting held on Sunday evening involved all members to looked and discussed issues concerning the smooth running of the link.

Two issues were discussed as follows.

Firstly: People of Newton really thank and appreciate the Olney people for their support towards the huge development you have done within the Newton community in particular.

Secondly: The people of Newton are still requesting for safe drinking water which is their felt need, reason because we have been facing with challenges with the said water wells which we constructed three to four years ago and most of these wells are not in good working conditions. We have to redrill and replace each submissive and an addition of one more mold in each well to reach water as to avoid such damages in future.

Our people of Olney. As you know we are very close to the dry season if we all put hands together it will save worst damages and the Newton people lives will be safe.

The link thought it fit to write and inform you that this is the most pressing need as of now any other need arises in future we will let you know.

The people of Newton highly appreciate you for all you have been doing for them as everyday they are seeing and benefiting from those facilities within the community. We also thank you for continue making us that link between the people of Newton and you (Olney).
